e n t h u s i a s m

means the student is **excited about learning to play the piano:**
excited, curious, interested, wanting to figure things out, full of questions

m o t i v a t i o n

means the student is **willing to do the work it takes to learn to play the piano:**
willing to follow instructions, having the desire to improve

c o m m i t m e n t

means the student is **doing the work it takes to learn to play the piano:**
following through

For most students, it is relatively easy to be enthusiastic, and usually motivated, but not committed. Commitment, for most students, especially young ones, needs to come from the parent: it is the parent's responsibility to follow through, to make sure the student has a good instrument and bench (plus footstool if necessary) at home, and all needed materials at the lesson. It is the parent's responsibility to make sure the student practices at home, following the instructions. If the student's enthusiasm and motivation waver - and they will - it is the parent's responsibility to fill in, temporarily, until the student's enthusiasm and motivation return.
